**Whereas** the Federal Government and the Bank of Canada have issued a request for nominations of a woman to be honored on the face of their new bank notes; and

**Whereas** Molly Brant, also known as Koñwatsi-tsiaiéñni is a generally unrecognized Canadian Heroine; and

**Whereas** she was famous in her own right, and played an important role in both Native and British culture in Kingston Ontario during the Loyalist period; and

**Whereas** through the early part of the American Revolution, Molly Brant sheltered and fed loyalists and sent arms and ammunition to those who were fighting for the King; and

**Whereas** Molly Brant was expected to use her influence over the Mohawk warriors as she was in a position to use the colonial administration to increase her political power to promote the interests of her people; and

**Whereas** after the war no provisions had been made for the Iroquois in the Treaty of Paris of 1783 and it has been suggested that Molly Brant used her influence on behalf of her people at this time to have land on the Bay of Quinte granted to the Iroquois; and

**Whereas** it was decided in 1783 that Cataraqui would be a good place for the settlement of the Loyalists and at which time Molly Brant decided to settle at Cataraqui at which time she was assigned Farm Lot A in Kingston Township; and

**Whereas** sadly on April 16, 1796 Molly Brant, a true Canadian Heroine died and was laid to rest in the burial grounds of St. George's Church, located at what became the corner of Queen Street and Montreal Street where St. Paul's Church now stands, but sadly the exact location of her plot is unknown;

**Therefore Be It Resolved That** the Council for the City of Kingston support the nomination of Molly Brant for consideration as the new face on the Canadian Bank note for 2018, and that this resolution be forwarded to the office of MP Mark Gerretsen and the office of Prime Minister Justin Trudeau.
