# a) New Provincial Child Care Funding Initiatives & Requirements

Mr. Laidman provided the Committee with an overview of the Report.

Councillor Hutchison arrived at the meeting at 6:06 p.m.

Councillor Holland requested an update regarding the status of the child care waitlist. Mr. Laidman responded that staff conducted an analysis of the existing system. He indicated that there is not a waitlist for subsidized spots. He stated that staff will examine expanding the eligibility of the system. He mentioned that most agencies are not close to maximum occupancy. Ms. Austin provided further information regarding the licensing aspect of the system.

Councillor Osanic questioned if the for-profit child care centres have been consulted regarding this matter. Ms. Austin responded that agencies were provided the report that is before the Committee for consideration. She commented that staff have not received any responses from the service providers.

Councillor Neill requested that Councillor Holland assume the role of Chair.

Councillor Neill sought further information regarding the subsidy criteria. Mr. Laidman provided the Committee with information regarding the two types of funding available. He spoke to the eligibility criteria for the subsidy.

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Mr. Laidman provided further information regarding the implications of the recommendation.

Councillor Neill resumed the role of Chair.

Councillor Neill questioned why the provincial government is focused on for-profit child care providers. Ms. Austin responded that the provincial government seeks to improve the quality of childcare.

Councillor Hutchison sought further information regarding wage enhancement. Ms. Austin provided the Committee with additional information regarding wage enhancement.

The Chair provided members of the public with an opportunity to provide comment.

Mr. Dixon requested that staff provide further data regarding the number of children in for-profit and non-profit childcare facilities.

Mr. Laidman indicated that in 2016, Kingston was two percent above the provincial threshold. He stated that if the system remains the current size it will be sustainable. He noted that staff continuously monitor changes to demographics. He indicated that the provincial government manages the number of licenses issued.

**That** the Arts, Recreation and Community Policies Committee recommend that Council approve an immediate "hold" on fee subsidy funding for new for-profit childcare operators until December 31, 2018; and

**That** the Arts, Recreation and Community Policies Committee recommend that Council approve a fee subsidy funding "hold" on expansion sites (new locations) for currently funded for-profit childcare operators that are not operational by December 1, 2017.
