



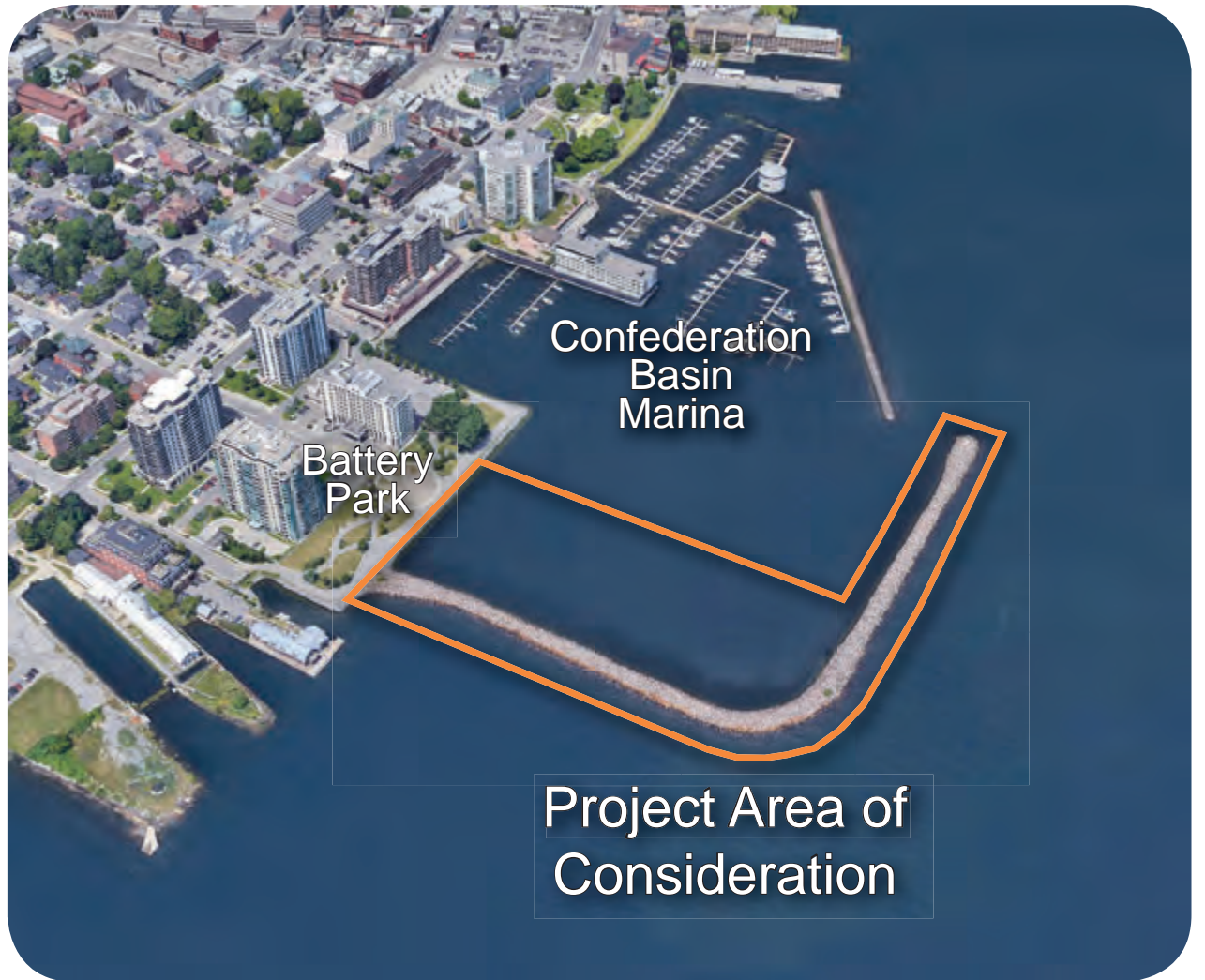
Confederation Basin Promenade

The Confederation Basin Promenade Project proposes a new accessible walkway and public space experience built on the existing stone breakwall that shelters Flora MacDonald Confederation Basin.

The Waterfront Master Plan (WFMP) conceptualized and consulted on the Promenade Project and a high level scope of work was established and approved by Council in 2016.

Formal public consultation is now underway. Your feedback is important in shaping the outcome of this unique and distinctive waterfront amenity.

Community Feedback Highlights

Information panels were displayed in Battery Park and online at Get Involved Kingston and on the project page. Public feedback was received during a Zoom open house and through an online survey at Get Involved Kingston between July 12 and August 3.

What we heard...

The feedback received during the first engagement for each of the questions was compiled into categories and recurring comments and themes were noted.

Question 1

What do you most value about this site?

Views, public access, Waterfront Trail, park and open space, proximity to downtown, shoreline protection.

Question 2

What should the City consider when developing the promenade project?

Accessible, inclusivity, inviting. Broad, connected pathways. Gathering areas with awesome views. Seating and rest areas. Shade. Water access and swimming.

Question 3

What do you like most about the proposed promenade project?

Public waterfront access, swimming opportunities, the pathway, enhancement of Kingston's downtown waterfront, accessibility, site furnishings.

Question 4

Project Enhancement preferences

Based on the results of public engagement and approval by City Council, project enhancements may be considered, subject to the ability to secure diverse sources of funding.

The choices, ranked in order of preference, are:

- A** Extending the walkway to the light house and providing a lookout area
- B** Widening the walkway and creating an enhanced entry area including upgraded public realm design elements
- C** Enhanced swimming space amenities
- D** Public art

Question 5

What other feedback would you like to provide on the Confederation Basin Promenade project?

The Promenade Project

The Confederation Basin Promenade Project proposes a new accessible walkway and public space experience built on the existing stone breakwall that shelters Flora MacDonald Confederation Basin.

The Council approved budget for the Project is \$2.695M which includes:

- Connection to Battery Park;
- The Promenade Walkway including lighting;
- Lookout Area at the bend;
- Water's Edge Access Amenity with restricted boat access;
- Seating Opportunities; and
- Artful elements.

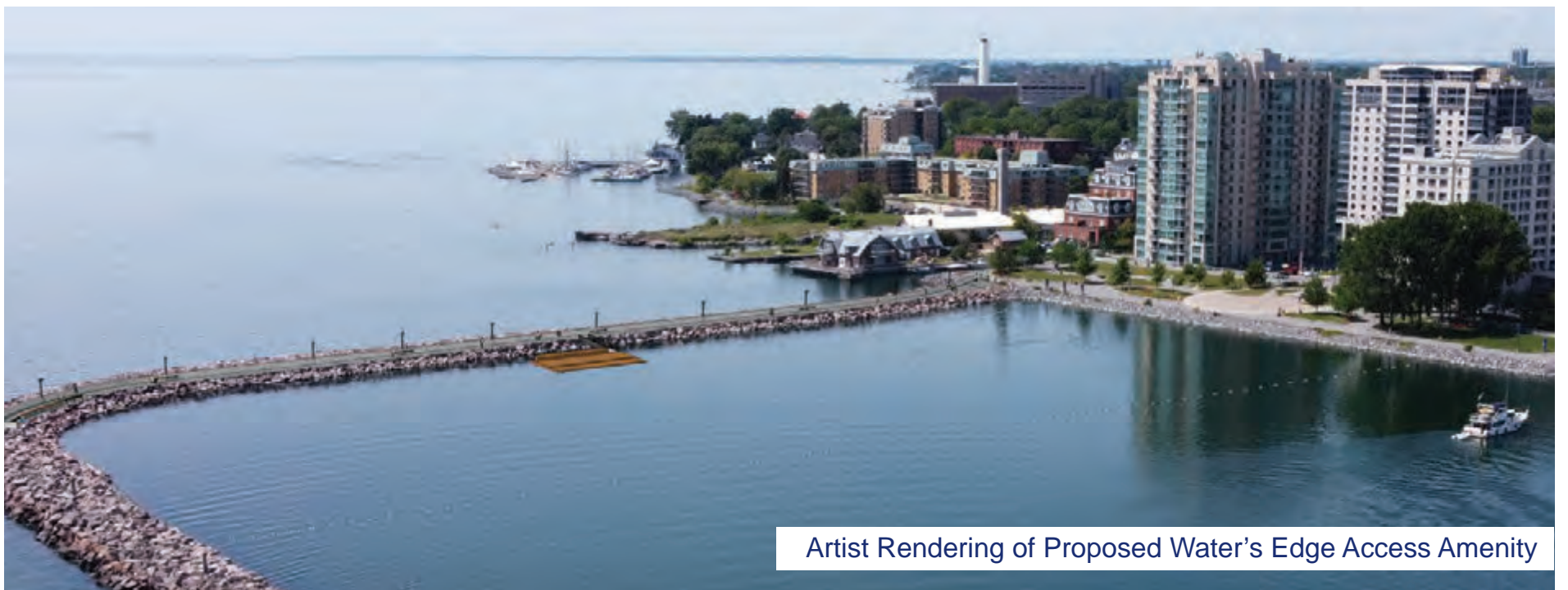

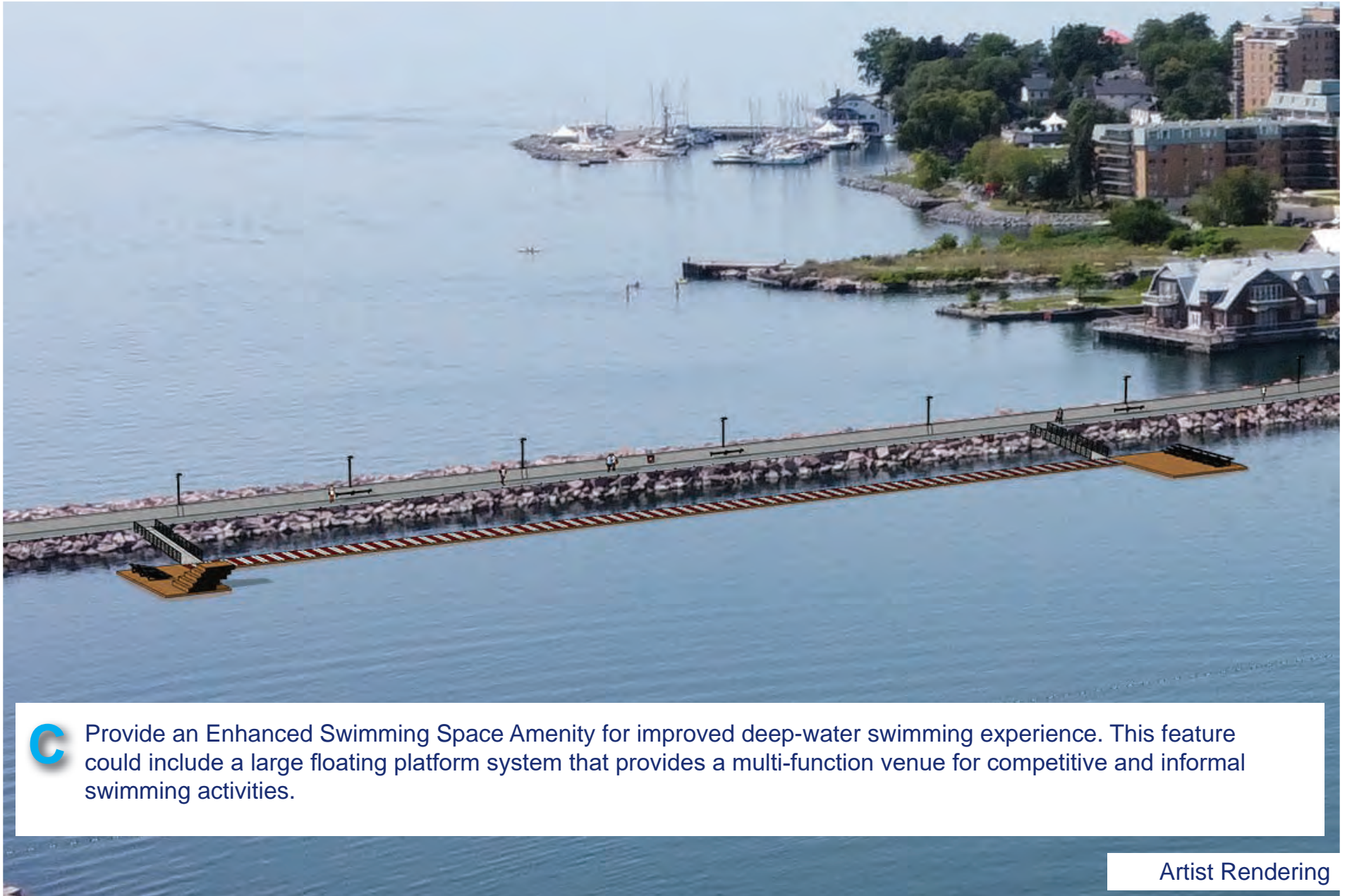
