Subject:	Award of Contract – 2019 Model Truck with a Construction Work Body

#### **Executive Summary:**

The Fleet Services Division issued a Request for Proposals (RFP) on behalf of the Public Works Department, for the purchase of one 2019 model year truck with a construction work body. This vehicle is a replacement for an existing unit that has fulfilled lifecycle expectations. Council approval is required because only one submission to the RFP was received therefore staff does not have delegated authority to proceed with the purchase.

#### **Recommendation:**

**That** the Mayor and City Clerk be authorized to enter into a contract with Petrie Ford, in a form satisfactory to the Director of Legal Services, for the purchase of one 2019 model year truck with a construction work body (F31-TPES-TS-FL-2019-03) for the total purchase price of \$60,764 plus applicable taxes.

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### **Options/Discussion:**

The Fleet Services Division issued a Request for Proposals (RFP) on behalf of the Public Works Department for the purchase of one 2019 model year truck with a construction work body. This vehicle is a replacement for an existing unit that has fulfilled lifecycle expectations. This truck is used by Public Works crews to transport materials and supplies for concrete maintenance work. The tools required to form concrete sidewalk panels and concrete curbs are very specific to this maintenance activity. The construction work body is designed with specific racking and storage compartments to store concrete forms, pins, concrete finishing tools, as well as power tools and the power supply for those tools.

The submission was evaluated using the following criteria:

- Pricing and Related Costs 45%
- Specification Compliant 42%
- Warranty 10%
- Accessibility Standards for Customer Service, Ontario Regulation 429/7 3%

The unit offered by Petrie Ford Sales is a 2019 model year Ford F450 crew cab chassis coupled with an 11-foot construction work body. This vehicle is propelled by a gasoline-powered engine and there is no equivalent electric vehicle available on the market. This proposal is compliant with the specifications requested in the RFP document.
