1. Applications Recommended for Approval (Statutory Consultation with Heritage Kingston)

i. Approval of Application for Heritage Permit - 752 King Street West/8 Estate Lane

That alterations to the property at 752 King Street West (8 Estate Lane), be approved in accordance with the details described in the application (File Number P18-025-2019), which was deemed complete on April 18, 2019 and amended May 14, 2019, with said alterations to include:

- 1. Repointing of the northern retaining wall (Wall 1), including dismantling and repair of the end pillar and in-kind replacement of select stone units, as necessary;
- 2. Installation of new steel guardrail on top of the eastern extent of Wall 1; and

That the approval of the alteration be subject to the following conditions:

- 1. A Building Permit shall be obtained, as necessary;
- 2. All masonry works shall be completed in accordance with the City's Policy on Masonry Restoration on Heritage Buildings;
- 3. Any reusable limestone materials in the current walls shall be incorporated into the new wall, wherever feasible;
- 4. The retaining wall may abut but shall not be physically attached to the Rockwood Villa;
- 5. The applicant shall consider installing a stone or plaque identifying the date of the reconstruction of the retaining wall;
- 6. A Tree Permit shall be obtained, as necessary, and any trees or plantings to be removed, shall be replaced in kind in the immediate area; and

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7. All equipment and building materials shall not be stored under or within the canopy limits of the trees on the north side of Wall 1.

Whereas Kingston City Council recognizes the threat climate change poses to our economy, our society and our environment; and

Whereas Kingston City Council declared a climate emergency and committed to demonstrated leadership on climate action as strategic priority; and

Whereas staff identified several strategies to reduce GHG emissions; and

Whereas staff recommend the corporate and community climate action plans be updated and combined as part of an overall Climate Change Management Strategy based on a framework of principles and practices for a sustainable community, such as the Natural Step Strategy, Partners for Climate Protection or similar; and

Whereas this work will start in 2019 and include significant public and stakeholder engagement and be presented to Council for final approval in 2021; and

Whereas a climate emergency requires immediate action;

Therefore Be It Resolved That Council approve a Working Group on Community Climate Action to be co-chaired by Councillor Doherty and Councillor Kiley; and

That the mandate of the Working Group on Climate Change be to promote, engage, educate and challenge Kingston residents, institutions and businesses to take immediate, effective, and inexpensive actions that will reduce GHG emissions in the community; and

That as co-chairs Councillor Doherty and Councillor Kiley be authorized to appoint representatives to the Working Group on Climate Change from the following areas: Queen's University, St. Lawrence College, the local school boards, Sustainable Kingston, the Kingston Climate Hub, 350 Kingston, KFL&A Public Health, SWITCH and Kingston Environmental Advisory Forum, it being understood that the working group shall not exceed 12 members in total; and

That the Working Group members are to be confirmed as soon as possible and that the first meeting take place in June; and

That the Working Group meet as necessary throughout summer 2019 in order to deliver ongoing key messaging to the community and complete its mandate by Q4 2019 with a presentation to Council at that time.
