g. the implementation of an application based COVID-19 Hardship Deferral Program - 2021 Interim Property Tax Billing for small business property owners.

1. Kingston Home Energy Retrofit Program

That Council receives the Kingston Home Energy Retrofit Program Rationale and Design Study, attached as Exhibit A to Report Number EITP-21-007, required as a pre-requisite to being eligible for applying to the Federation of Canadian Municipalities Community Energy Financing program; and

That Council direct staff to include the related funding for the Kingston Home Energy Retrofit Program in the draft 2021 capital budget; and

That Council direct staff to prepare a grant and loan application to the Federation of Canadian Municipalities Community Energy Financing program for funding the set-up and launch phase, and the operations of the Kingston Home Energy Retrofit Program as outlined in the Kingston Home Energy Retrofit Program Rationale and Design Study attached as Exhibit A to Report Number EITP-21-007, subject to approval of the City's 2021 budget; and

That the Chief Administrative Officer or designate be delegated the authority to sign applications for the Federation of Canadian Municipalities Community Energy Financing program; and

That the By-Law "A By-Law to Authorize the Undertaking of Energy Efficiency and Water Conservation Works on Private Residential Property as Local Improvements under the Kingston Home Energy Retrofit Program (KHERP)", attached as Exhibit B to Report Number EITP-21-007, be presented to Council for the first and second reading, as passing the by-law is a pre-requisite to being

eligible for applying to the Federation of Canadian Municipalities Community Energy Financing program; and

That staff report back to the Environment, Infrastructure & Transportation Policies Committee in Q3 2021, following notification from FCM on the City's funding application with the final program details including the results of additional stakeholder consultation and a recommendation regarding the implementation of the Kingston Home Energy Retrofit Program.

Whereas in March 2019 Kingston City Council became the first municipality in Ontario to declare a climate emergency; and

Whereas in May 2019 Council's Strategic Plan committed the municipality (the corporation and the community) to becoming carbon neutral by 2040; and

Whereas municipalities account for 50% of global emissions thus necessitating further action by all sectors and other levels of government; and

Whereas the Ontario government recently purchased 3 gas plants, a move that could lead to the increase of provincial greenhouse gas pollution by more than 400% by 2040; and

Whereas a number of municipalities, as partners in government, have passed motions to ask Queen's Park to reverse this decision in keeping with the need to reduce, not increase, greenhouse gas emissions;

Therefore Be It Resolved That the City of Kingston write to the Minister of Municipal Affairs and Housing and the Minister of Environment, Conservation, Energy, and Parks to request that the Government of Ontario develop and implement a plan to phase-out all gas-fired electricity generation as soon as possible to ensure that Kingston has a clear path to achieve our climate action goals; and

That the City of Kingston write the respective portfolio critics, all party leaders in the Legislature, and the Association of Municipalities of Ontario, requesting that the Government of Ontario develop and implement a plan to phase-out all gasfired electricity generation in order to reduce provincial greenhouse gas emissions as soon as possible.
