Whereas the number of COVID-19 cases have increased substantially within the Province of Ontario over the last month; and

Whereas a number of COVID-19 patients from the Greater Toronto Area (GTA) have been relocated to Kingston hospitals in order to address the lack of hospital capacity within the GTA; and

Whereas these additional patients and related care have put added pressures on healthcare workers at Kingston General Hospital who have seen an increase in their work loads and changes to their schedules; and

Whereas the Council of the City of Kingston has a desire to support hospital workers who are on the front line by removing barriers to access parking;

Therefore Be It Resolved That City Council waive on-street parking permit fees on neighbourhood streets in proximity to Kingston General Hospital until the end of June for frontline employees identified by Kingston General Hospital and displaying appropriate eligibility within their vehicles; and

That Council direct staff to continue to enforce all other parking regulations including metered on and off street parking as well as neighbourhood street parking according to City of Kingston By-Law 2010-128, A By-Law to Regulate Parking; and

That Council encourages Queen's University and Kingston Health Sciences Centre to implement similar approaches and remove barriers to provide hospital workers access to nearby parking lots owned and operated by Queen's University and Kingston Health Sciences Centre.

To the Councillors and Mayor of the City of Kingston,

I am writing you today to urge you, in the strongest possible terms, to reject this proposed encampment protocol.

The directives laid out in A National Protocol for Homeless Encampments in Canada should apply to all encampments, in all municipalities.

The City's own report suggests that the encampments in Kingston are too small for consideration under the National Protocol.

I was sickened to read that, as it was an indication to me that the City Staff felt the encamped people in Kingston weren't worthy of having their Human Rights considered first and foremost.

The City's proposed protocol is bound to result in more trauma for vulnerable people, more work for City By-Law enforcement officers & Kingston Police staff, and an increase in distrust between the City and its most vulnerable residents.

In light of the most recent Point In Time Count, conducted on April 14th in the City of Kingston (<https://www.thewhig.com/news/local-news/more-than-200-homeless-counted-in-kingston-shelters>) which reported over 200 people without homes, I think City Council must pause and commit to developing new solutions which can and will actually help our most vulnerable citizens.

By the City's own numbers (Monthly Shelter Utilization reports), there are a total of 69 beds in the shelter system, and those are Pre-COVID numbers.

The capacity totals on those reports are not reflecting the reduction in beds that exists in reality, on account of social distancing measures.

There have been many, many nights the only co-ed adult shelter (In From the Cold) was at capacity, even as recently as April 17, 2020.

The ICH is not a shelter, nor is it equipped to meet the needs of the vast number of people it serves. Because of its co-location with the CTS (supervised consumption/treatment site), it will always be associated with drugs, which makes it a dangerous place to be for someone in addiction recovery.

The ICH is absolutely necessary, but it's seriously overloaded, and by it's nature there are people it won't serve.

We need more good solutions like the ICH, and in more places.

There were Kingstonians sleeping outside all winter- I met many of them.

Even more sleep a few nights a week on a friend's couch or floor, or even in hallways or ATM lobbies.

I urge you all to consider the serious and pervasive nature of homelessness in Kingston. The Point in Time Count, the reports from the HHA Committee and from shelter and ICH staff are only painting a fraction of the overall picture.

Much more needs to be done, and until there are enough appropriate options for people without homes, I urge you to refrain from moving them along every 48 hours.

There is nowhere else for people to go.

200+ people cannot possibly be served by 69 shelter beds, even if you also take the 35 mattresses & cots at the ICH into account for a total of 104 sleeping/resting places.

Please, please, do not endorse this protocol of chasing vulnerable people who have no homes and few options.

Mr Hutchison, as one of your constituents I will be watching your vote this evening, and I very much hope you will use your vote to uphold the human rights and basic dignity of people in our City.

Encampment Protocol Procedures

These procedures will be executed when dealing with one or a few tents/structures that have appeared in public spaces. and on private properties.

Municipal Land: Notification and response time 24-48 hrs for initial contact. 14 days before eviction (with opportunity for discretion thereafter)

1. Initial identification and communication will occur with Street Outreach.

- visit the site,
- determine the situation,
- complete a high-level assessment of health and safety on-site,
- complete a high-level assessment of needs and provide information on services available,

Street Outreach during a 14 day period will provide supports including but not limited to the following:

- Engagement that treats every individual from a rights-based approach, with regards to race, ethnicity, culture, disability, gender identity, sexual orientation, and other characteristics. ensuring dignity and confidentiality are maintained;
- An assessment of immediate health, social needs and housing plan of an individual with consent;
- Determine previous (if any) barriers affecting access into the system and offered by the Street Outreach and also requested by the individual as well as inclusive engagement of Aboriginal Community Groups and Organizations and of other community services/supports.

- Informing individuals of the timeline for encampment removal taking into consideration location and individual health and social circumstances;
- Assist with the movement to shelter/housing including but not limited to transportation, financial assistance, and storage of possessions.
- Ensures abandoned belongings and litter are cleared and the site is cleaned.
- While outreach staff work to engage encampment residents and secure alternative shelter and housing options and community supports, Municipal Law Enforcement, and Parks staff will continue to monitor these locations and address safety concerns and increase litter clean up during this period until the encampment is cleared.

Prohibited Areas: all individuals experiencing homelessness in encampments – even when deemed high acuity or engaged with outreach in the 14-day grace period outlined above - are subject to the following restrictions and may be removed or moved if not in compliance with them:

-
- No more than 5 in an encampment;
-
- No encampments on sidewalks, roadways or boulevards;
-
- Encampments must not encumber an entrance or exit or deemed fire route;
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- Encampments must be 50 meters from a playground, school or childcare centre;
-
- No encampments within any property with an environmental or heritage designation; and
-
- Situations, where health and safety concerns exist for those living within or adjacent to an encampment, will be addressed in a reasonable fashion, in good faith, on a case by case ba-

sis by the City that balances the needs of both the person experiencing homelessness/encamped individuals and the community members. In these situations, the City will consult with the Street Outreach, Mental Health, Community Organizations, Community Groups working with the individual(s) to determine how to best balance the needs of persons experiencing homelessness/encamped individuals and other community members.

By-Law Number 2021-xxx

A By-Law to Amend By-Law Number 76-26, “A By-Law to Regulate the Use of Lands and the Character, Location and Use of Buildings and Structures in the Township of Kingston” (Removal of Holding Symbol, 1125/1127 Unity Road)

Passed: [Meeting Date]

Whereas by Order of the Minister of Municipal Affairs and Housing, The Corporation of the Township of Kingston, The Corporation of the Township of Pittsburgh and The Corporation of the City of Kingston were amalgamated on January 1, 1998 to form The Corporation of the City of Kingston as the successor municipal corporation and pursuant to the Minister’s Order, any by-laws of the former municipality passed under the *Planning Act* continue as the by-laws covering the area of the former municipality now forming part of the new City; and

Whereas the property owner has submitted an application requesting the removal of the Holding ‘H’ Symbol from the lands municipally known as 1125/1127 Unity Road; and

Whereas the owner has complied with the conditions for the removal of the Holding ‘H’ Symbol as follows:

- Clearance to remove the Holding ‘H’ Symbol has been provided by Building Services, Transportation Services, Kingston Fire & Rescue, and the Environment Division; and
- The Council of The Corporation of the City of Kingston has given notice pursuant to the requirements of the *Planning Act* of its intention to pass a By-Law to remove the Holding ‘H’ Symbol; and

Whereas the Council of The Corporation of the City of Kingston deems it advisable to amend By-Law Number 76-26, as amended, of the former Township of Kingston;

Therefore be it resolved that the Council of The Corporation of the City of Kingston hereby enacts as follows:

1. By-Law Number 76-26 of The Corporation of the City of Kingston, entitled “A By-Law to Regulate the Use of Lands and the Character, Location and Use of Buildings and Structures in the Township of Kingston”, as amended, is hereby further amended as follows:
 - 1.1. Map 1 of Schedule “A”, as amended, is hereby further amended by changing the zone symbol of the subject lands from ‘R1-20-H’ to ‘R1-20’ to

permit a second residential unit within the existing Semi-Detached Dwelling House, for a total of two dwelling units on the property, as shown on Schedule "A" attached to and forming part of By-Law Number 2021-xxx.

2. This By-Law shall come into force in accordance with the provisions of the *Planning Act*.
