Executive Summary:

In this report staff are recommending two housekeeping by-law amendments for the operation of the City's short-term rental licensing program. An amendment to By-Law Number 2005-10, A By-law to Establish Fees and Charges to be Collected by The Corporation of the City of Kingston, and an amendment to By-Law Number 2010-205, A By-Law to Define the Mandate and Meeting Procedures for Committees Established by the Corporation of the City of Kingston.

The amendment to By-law Number 2005-10 is to establish the short-term rental operator license fee (\$180.00) and the appeal to the Appeals Committee in the case of a refusal, suspension or revocation of a short-term rental operator license fee (\$309.00). The amendment to By-Law Number 2010-205 is to add the ability to hear appeals to the refusal, suspension or revocation of a short-term rental operator license to the mandate of the Appeals Committee.

Recommendation:

That a by-law to amend By-Law Number 2005-10, A By-law to Establish Fees and Charges to be Collected by The Corporation of the City of Kingston, as amended, attached as Exhibit A to Report Number 21-139, be presented to Council for all three readings; and

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That a by-law to amend By-Law Number 2010-205, A By-Law to Define the Mandate and Meeting Procedures for Committees Established by the Corporation of the City of Kingston, as amended, attached as Exhibit B to Report Number 21-139, be presented to Council for all three readings.

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Options/Discussion:

On December 15, 2020, Council approved a short-term rental license program to be enacted through By-Law Number 2021-10, A By-Law to License and Regulate Short-term Rentals in the City of Kingston (the Short-term Rental Licensing By-Law). As part of this by-law, all short-term rental operators are required to obtain a license from the City at a cost of \$180.00. The authority to collect similar municipal license fees is found in By-Law Number 2005-10, A By-law to Establish Fees and Charges to be Collected by The Corporation of the City of Kingston (the Fees and Charges By-Law), which is updated annually prior to the start of a new calendar year.

For 2021, the Fees and Charges By-Law was updated at the same Council meeting (December 15, 2020) as the passage of the Short-term Rental Licensing By-Law. As Council had yet to approve the Short-term Rental Licensing By-Law, staff did not deem it appropriate to include a license fee in the Fees and Charges By-Law that had not yet been established through Council approval. As a result of this timing, staff are currently recommending Council approve an amendment to the Fees and Charges By-Law to add two fees related to the Short-term Rental Licensing By-Law:

- A \$180.00 fee for obtaining a short-term rental operator license; and
- A \$309.00 fee for filing an appeal to the Appeals Committee in the case of a refusal, suspension or revocation of a short-term rental operator license.

The appeal fee outlined above is being harmonized with the sign and fence bylaw appeal fee currently within the fees and charges by-law.

Similar to the above, staff are recommending an amendment to By-Law Number 2010-205, A By-Law to Define the Mandate and Meeting Procedures for Committees Established by the Corporation of the City of Kingston, (the Committee By-Law). Section 2.5 of the Short-term Rental Licensing By-Law establishes that a person whose application for a new license, or renewal license has been refused, or whose license has been suspended or revoked, may submit an application to the City of Kingston Appeals Committee for a review of the decision. Exhibit B of this report provides the necessary amendment to By-Law Number 2010-205 which will add the authority to hear these reviews to the mandate of the Appeals Committee.

As the short-term rental licensing by-law comes into effect on June 1, 2021, and both by-law amendments are housekeeping in nature, staff are recommending that the amending by-laws receive all three readings at the May 18, 2021 Council meeting to allow for all aspects of the licensing program to be operationalized in advance of the program launch.
