Executive Summary:

The Municipal Act, 2001, provides the Council of The Corporation of the City of Kingston with the authority to delegate its powers to a person or body, subject to some noted restrictions. Council has exercised its authority to delegate certain powers and duties to Committees and municipal staff. On October 4, 2016, Council passed <u>By-law 2016-189</u>, "A By-law to Consolidate the Delegation of Powers and Duties" in order to consolidate a number of existing delegations of authority. The by-law being presented in this report does not change staff's current delegated authority approved by Council. The by-law being presented is a housekeeping by-law, which will amend By-law 2016-189 by organizing the delegations by position and consolidating further delegations that were already approved by Council.

Recommendation:

THAT a by-law be presented to Council to amend By-law 2016-189, "A By-law to Consolidate the Delegation of Powers and Duties", by deleting Schedule "A" in its entirety and replacing it with the revised Schedule "A" to By-law 2021-XX, attached as Exhibit "A" to Report Number 21-044.

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Options/Discussion:

The delegation of authority from City Council contributes to the efficient management of the City, while still adhering to the principles of accountability and transparency. In 2016, City staff undertook a comprehensive review of City By-laws and Council resolutions to consolidate various authorities delegated by Council. On October 4, 2016, staff presented <u>Report Number 16-317</u> to Council, which recommended the enactment of a by-law to consolidate Council's delegations of powers and duties. <u>By-law 2016-189</u>, "A By-law to Consolidate the Delegation of Powers and Duties", was passed at the same meeting, and includes a list of substantive delegations.

Since the passing of By-law 2016-189 (as amended), further authorities have been delegated from Council to staff. These delegations of authority are reflected in the revised Schedule "A" to By-law 2021-XX, attached hereto as Exhibit "A", and will replace Schedule "A" of By-law 2016-189. For easier reference, the revised Schedule "A" of By-law 2016-189 has been organized by position. For future delegations of authority, City staff will continue to recommend the passing of a by-law to amend By-law 2016-189, by adding the specific delegation to Schedule "A" of the by-law.
