## **Options/Discussion:**

The Municipal Accessibility Advisory Committee (MAAC) is established under the provisions of the Accessibility for Ontarians with Disabilities Act. The Committee is legislated to provide advice to Council on a variety of topics, including the preparation, implementation and effectiveness of the City of Kingston Accessibility Plan.

To assist the Committee in its work, staff prepare a work plan at the start of each year outlining activities that will be undertaken by the Committee. The work plan is developed in consultation with City staff and the Chair of the Committee in advance of presentation to the Committee at large.

The following are proposed by staff for inclusion in the work plan:

- Update reports and briefings provided by a variety of City departments and groups.
   These reports provide the Committee with an update on accessibility activities undertaken in the previous year and those planned for future years. A list of proposed briefings can be found in Exhibit A 2022 Municipal Accessibility Advisory Committee Work Plan.
- Creation of the 2023-2025 Multi-Year Accessibility Plan. The Committee will work with staff to create and approve the next Multi-Year Accessibility Plan, as required under the Accessibility for Ontarians with Disabilities Act. Work will include public engagement throughout the creation of the plan.
- Quarterly information reports from the City of Kingston Accessibility Office. These reports
  provide an update on customer service statistics related to accessibility and other staff
  work done to further corporate accessibility
- Quarterly reports from the Awareness & Education and Built Environment Working Groups.
- The annual awareness and education campaign for National AccessAbility Week, May 29 to June 4, 2022. Staff work with the Awareness & Education Working Group to plan and execute a public education campaign related to accessibility.
- City of Kingston participation in Disabilities Mentoring Day, which takes place annually in late October. For this event City staff volunteer to be matched with persons with disabilities who are seeking access to workplace contacts, environments, skills, and human resource processes.
- Planning the annual Celebrating Accessibility Awards, which recognize persons, groups
  or organizations that have made or are making a significant contribution beyond
  legislated requirements, towards improving access for persons with disabilities in
  Kingston. Activities including selecting award recipients and hosting the annual awards
  presentation.
