#### **Options/Discussion:**

#### **Background**

The Housing and Homelessness Advisory Committee (HHAC) provides City Council advice regarding policies, directives and strategies related to housing and homelessness. To assist HHAC members in their understanding of work-related activities, staff bring forward a work plan with proposed work items.

To ensure that the feedback of HHAC members is included in the 2024/2025 work plan, staff are bringing forward this report to allow members the option to provide input. It will also allow for discussion on <a href="Kingston's Strategic Plan 2023-2026">Kingston's Strategic Plan 2023-2026</a> ('the Plan') to ensure alignment with housing-related items identified within the five core pillars of the Plan. The Plan's <a href="webpage">webpage</a> allows members of the public to view real-time tracking of the progress on each of the five pillars of the Plan.

Below is a list of some key initiatives identified under the first pillar of the Plan (Support Housing Affordability) that staff anticipate will be good items to receive committee advice and feedback on during the 2024/2025 committee meetings.

Staff also included Council priorities in pillars two, four and five that have an impact on housing which can foster cross-sector collaboration between City departments and community partners.

#### 1.1 Promote increased supply and affordability of housing

- 1.1.1 Seek opportunities to foster innovative approaches to housing
  - Establish a Hack-A-House in partnership with institutions, developers, not-for-profit and public using Mayor's Innovation Challenge model
- 1.2 Promote an increase in purpose-built rental housing
- 1.3 Increase supply of new-build not-for-profit and co-op housing and ensure sustainability and quality of existing stock
- 1.3.2 Invest in affordable and supportive housing
  - Review rental assistance and rent supplement programs to support low-income workers
