How to Hand Wash:

HOW handwash



Wet hands with warm water.



Apply soap.

Lather hands for 20 seconds



Lather soap and rub hands palm to palm.



Rub in between hand with palm of other hand.



Rub back of each hand with palm of other hand.



Rub fingertips of each hand in opposite palm.



Rub each thumb clasped in opposite hand.



Rinse thoroughly under running water.



Pat hands dry with paper towel.



Turn off water using paper towel.




PPE Donning Sequence:

	Put on gown	2
	Put on mask or N95 Respirator ™	3
	Put on eye protection (goggles/face shield)	4
	Put on gloves	5



Respiratory Etiquette:



Move it



Move away from others when you feel a sneeze or cough coming on.

Catch it





Cover your mouth and nose with a tissue when you sneeze or cough. If you don't have a tissue, cough or sneeze into your sleeve or elbow, not into your hands!

Bin it



Discard any used tissue in a garbage container.

Kill it



Wash or sanitize hands immediately. Remember to rub hands for at least 20 seconds!

STOP THE SPREAD OF INFECTION

Infections (such as influenza, COVID-19, cold viruses, and even whooping cough) are spread by coughing or sneezing. When you cough or sneeze on your hands, your hands carry and spread these infectious agents. When you touch an object such as a door handle, elevator button, telephone or computer keyboard with unclean hands, you are spreading germs. The next person who touches these objects may pick up these germs and get sick if they do not clean their hands before touching their eyes, nose or mouth.
